## Purpose of the Role

To provide high-quality teaching and learning that secures excellent progress for all pupils, contributes positively to the life of the school, and upholds the school's ethos and values. The postholder will create a safe, inclusive, and stimulating environment where children thrive academically, socially, and personally.

## Key Responsibilities

### Teaching and Learning

- Plan and deliver engaging, well-structured lessons that meet the needs of all learners.
- Set high expectations for behaviour, learning, and achievement.
- Use assessment effectively to inform planning, track progress, and identify next steps.
- Provide clear feedback to pupils to support their understanding and improvement.
- Ensure learning is ambitious, inclusive, and aligned with the school's curriculum.
- Adapt teaching to respond to the strengths and needs of all pupils, including those with SEND or additional needs.
- Promote a love of learning and foster children's curiosity and independence.

### Classroom Environment

- Create a positive, purposeful, and well-organised learning environment.
- Maintain high standards of classroom presentation and display.
- Ensure the classroom is safe, welcoming, and conducive to learning.
- Use resources effectively to support learning and engagement.

### Behaviour and Relationships

- Build strong, respectful relationships with pupils, modelling positive behaviour and attitudes.

- Implement the school's behaviour policy consistently and fairly.
- Promote pupils' wellbeing, resilience, and personal development.
- Work in partnership with parents and carers to support children's learning and progress.

## Curriculum and Assessment

- Contribute to the development and review of the school's curriculum.
- Participate in moderation, data analysis, and assessment activities.
- Use formative and summative assessment to secure strong outcomes for all pupils.
- Identify pupils who may need additional support and work with colleagues to implement appropriate strategies.

## Professional Responsibilities

- Work collaboratively with colleagues as part of a supportive staff team.
- Participate in staff meetings, INSET days, and professional development opportunities.
- Contribute to the wider life of the school, including clubs, events, and enrichment activities.
- Maintain accurate records and fulfil statutory responsibilities.
- Uphold the school's safeguarding responsibilities and follow all policies and procedures.
